1 A country of inventions

Scotland is a small country but during the last 400 years a lot of inventions have come from Scotland. You have already heard about Alexander Graham Bell who invented the telephone and John Dunlop who made cycling better and more comfortable with the tyres he invented. James Watt built the first steam engine and John Logie Baird, who was also a Scot, invented television. So our TV is a Scottish invention too.

Many inventors were engineers. But there are not only great Scottish engineers and inventors. There are also many good doctors who came from Scotland. One of them was Alexander Fleming. He was born in 1881. His parents were farmers in the Scottish countryside. He went to school in Scotland and then he moved to London where he worked in an office. In 1902 he went to university and became a doctor. He worked in a hospital in London and discovered¹ penicillin in 1928. He found that penicillin could fight illnesses² like a sore throat. But it took more than 10 years before the first patient could have penicillin.

King George VI made him a knight in 1944. He won the Nobel Prize in 1945 and worked until he died in 1955.

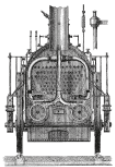
